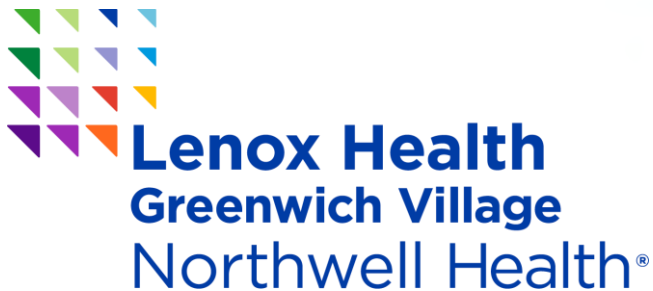

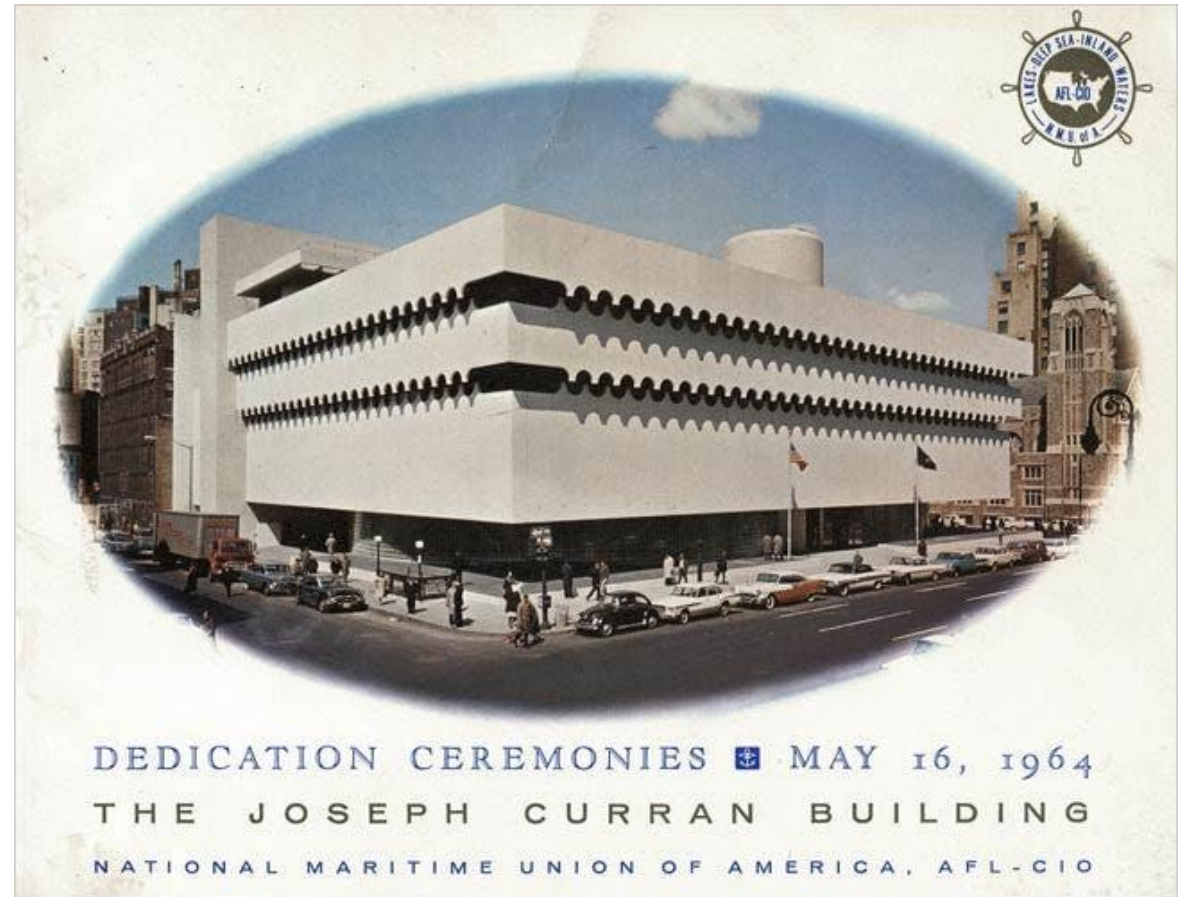

- **1963:** Originally built to house the headquarters of the National Maritime Union, the building was named the Joseph Curran Building and was designed by Albert C. Ledner
- **1969:** Included in Greenwich Village Historic District
- **1973:** National Maritime Union sells building to St. Vincent Catholic Medical Center; building renamed the Edward and Theresa O'Toole Medical Services building
- **2010:** St. Vincent Catholic Medical Center closes

**2011:** The building was acquired by Northwell Health





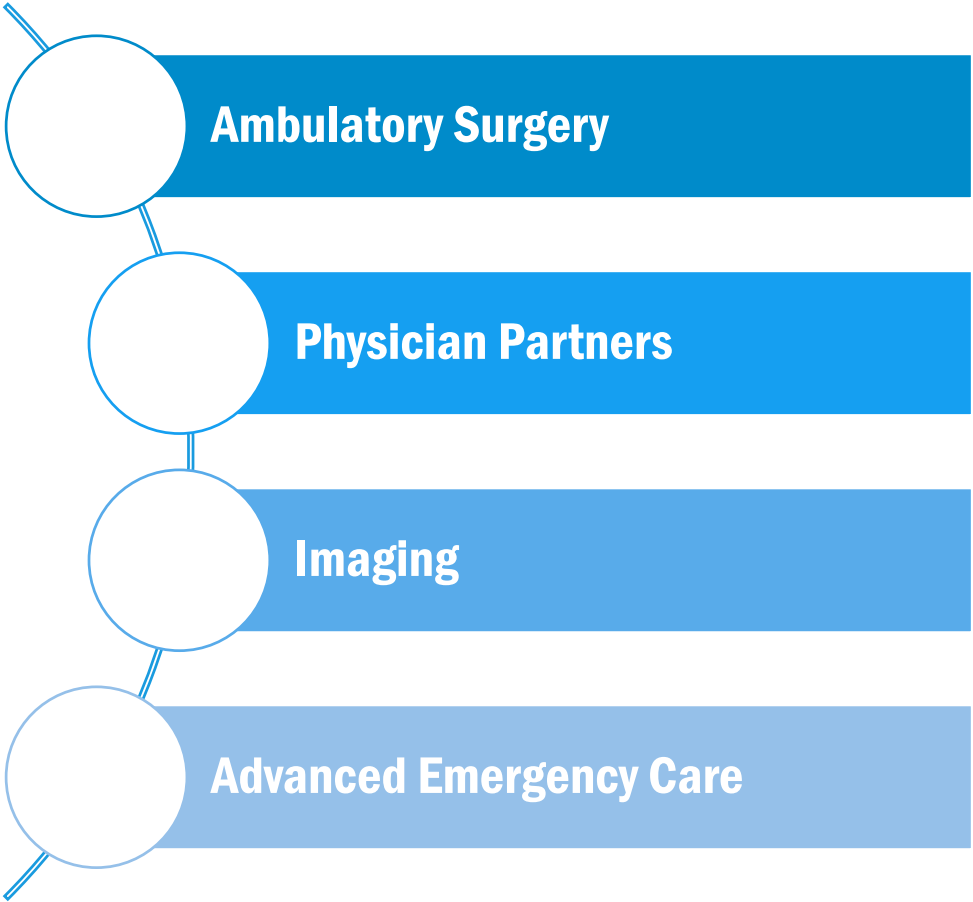

# LHGV EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT TREAT & RELEASE PATIENT ORIGIN

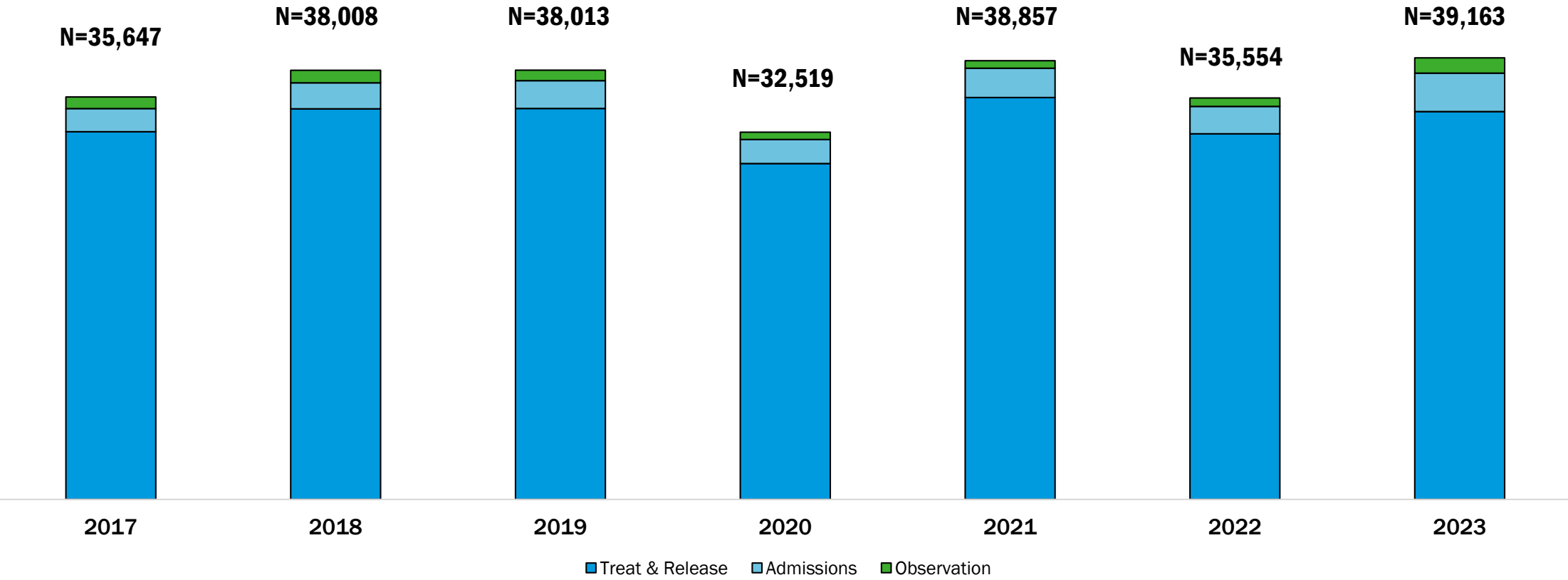
LHGV ED T&R Patient Origin, 2022

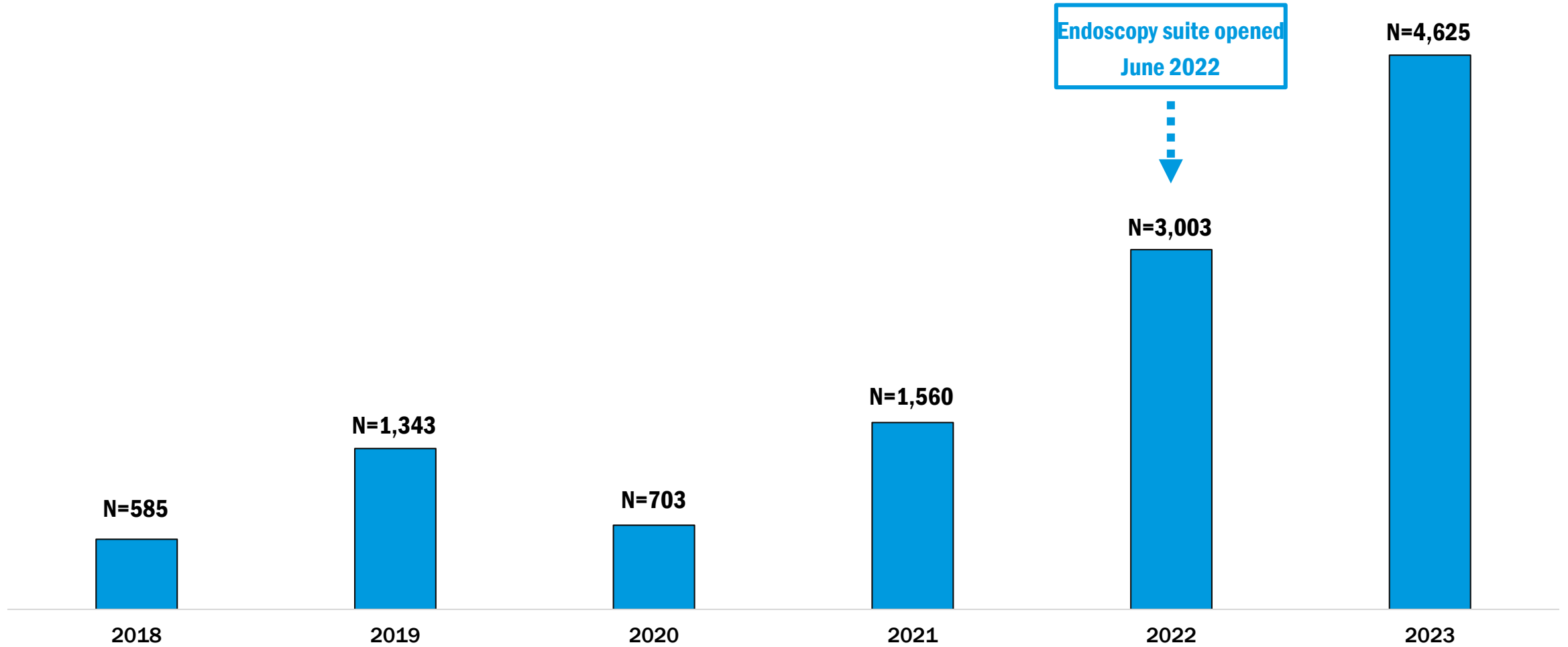

# EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT HISTORICAL VOLUME, 2017-2023



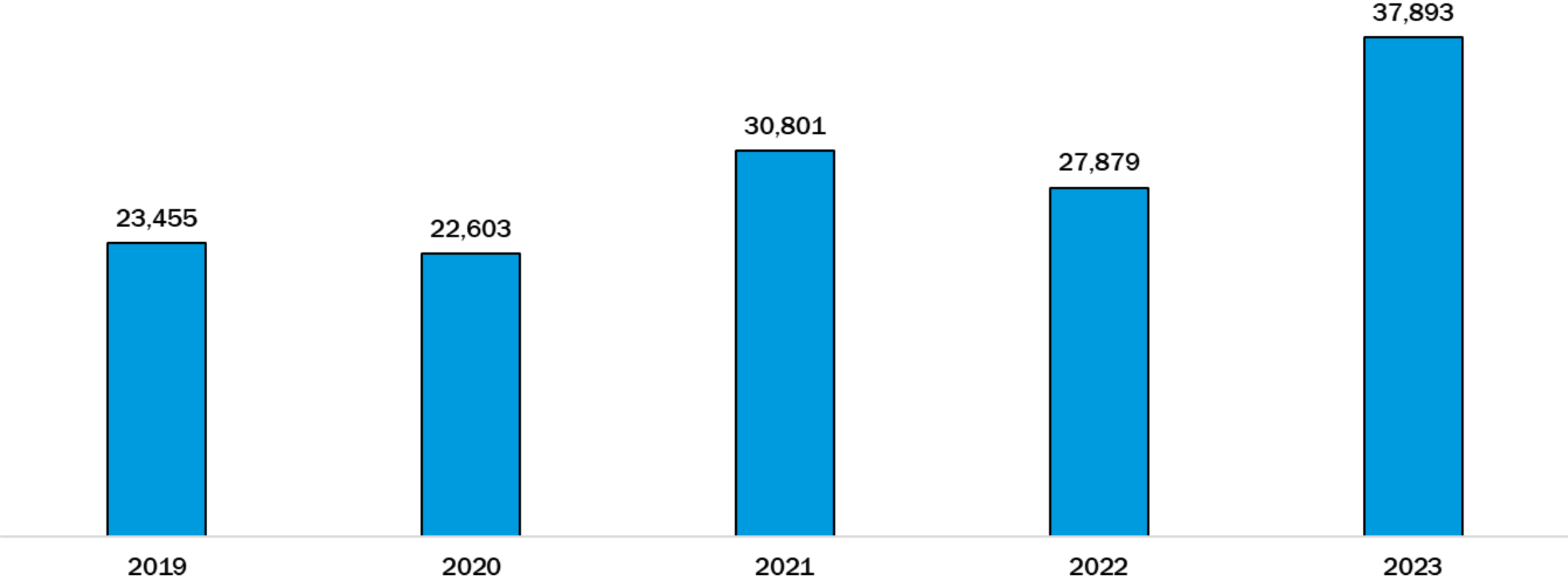

## CENTRALIZED TRANSFER CENTER

*24/7 streamlined coordination for all patient clinical transfers, medical transportation and referrals to ensure quick and easy-care handoff.*

Physician or designee initiates a call to our center

Tier is determined based on triage of patient acuity

Nominal data set is collected for transport

Determination of AutoLaunch

Acceptance of dashboard review for accommodations, and call status\*

# NORTHWELL HEALTH VIRTUAL ICU: ED SUPPORT OUTCOMES

## Virtual ICU Site: Lenox Health Greenwich Village

73 Patient encounters for LHGV from 1/1/24 - 3/31/24

85% of Virtual ICU support was initiated by the ED RN at bedside

100% of patient encounters had improved or stabilized patient outcome

89% of patients supported by Virtual ICU were planned or potential transfers

71% of patient encounters were initiated on night shift

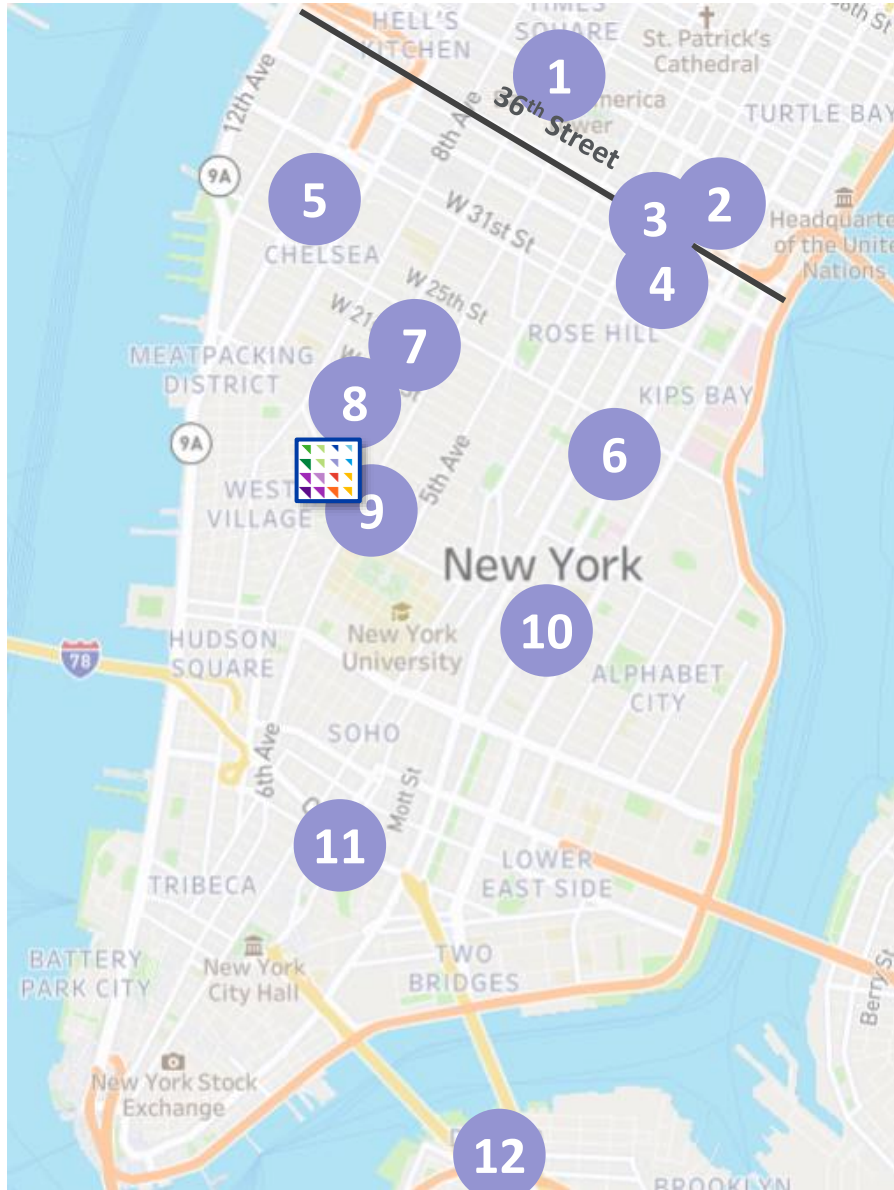
Patient outcome is assessed by the Virtual ICU RN at completion of the intervention, utilizing clinical judgment.

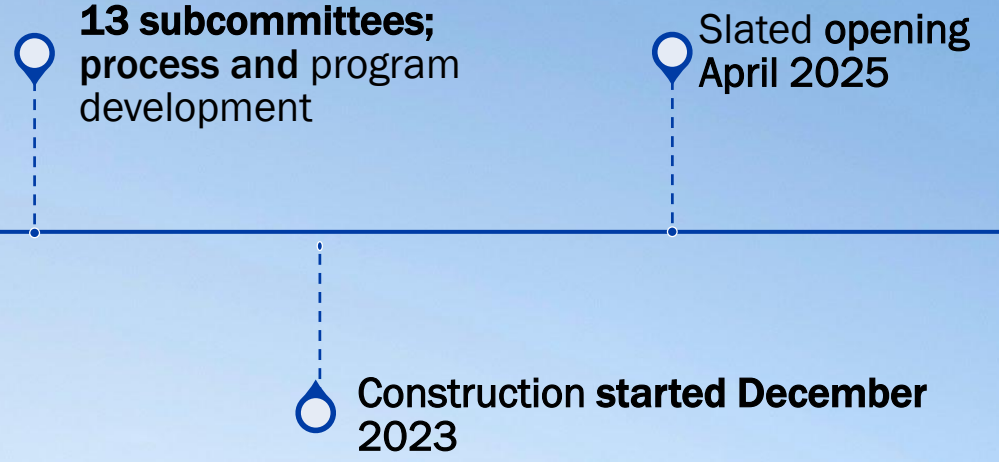

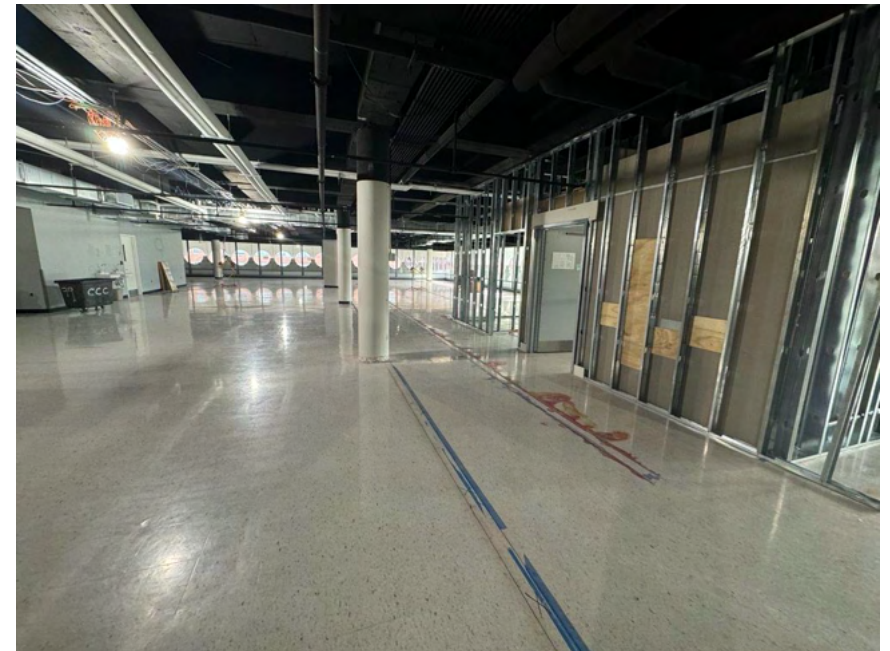

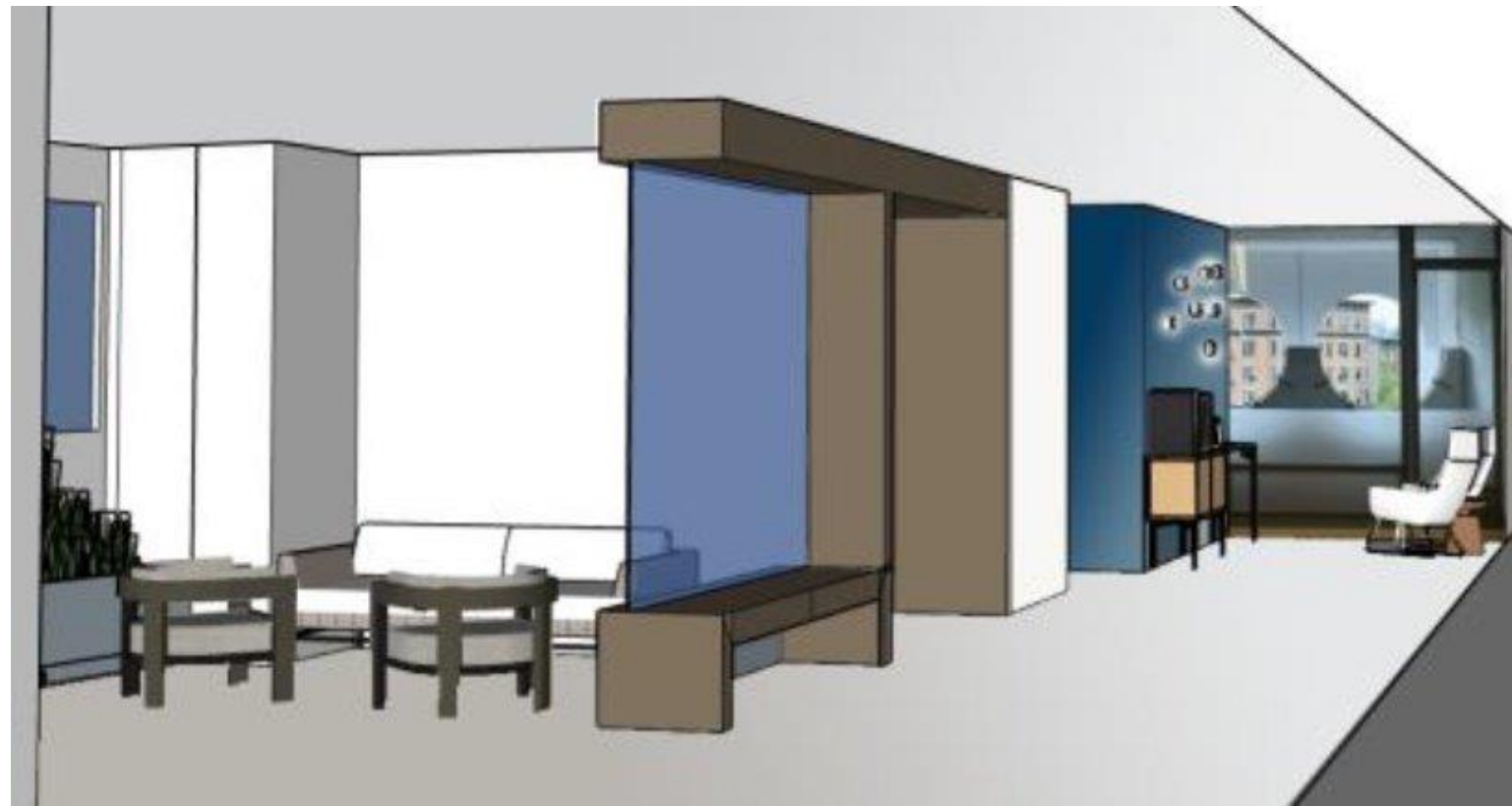

# Let's Clear Up the Confusion!

It was 2014 when Lenox Health Greenwich Village (LHGV), in that white building at 30 7th Avenue on 13th Street, opened its doors. There was a lot of skepticism, confusion and misunderstanding about it then, much of which remains to this day.

Since it's been 10 years and I've been hearing good things about LHGV, I reached out to Tracy Feiertag, MS, DHA, Deputy Executive Director, to learn more about the now.

Let's start with names and terminology. For example, I have always thought the name was Lenox Hill Greenwich Village or Northwell Health's Greenwich Village. And I thought it was an Emergency Department only.

Northwell Health acquired the landmarked modern building at 30 Seventh Avenue, between 12th and 13th Streets, from The Rudin Management Company, which had acquired it as part of its purchase of the former St. Vincent's Hospital facilities in 2010.

Not so long ago, Saint Vincent's Hospital was one of the oldest and most revered hospitals in the city. In March 2009, St. Vincent's got the city Landmarks Preservation Commission (LPC) approval for the design of a replacement hospital. They needed to demol-

Building," after extensive exterior restoration to its former glory, is the Lenox Health Greenwich Village medical facility.

Upper East Side Lenox Hill Hospital merged into the Northwell Health system in 2010, thus the 2014 opening of Lenox Health Greenwich Village (LHGV) in Northwell's 160,000-square-foot building housed Manhattan's first and only freestanding emergency center, imaging and ambulatory surgery centers, a medical pavilion and community conference center.
