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- Ms. Anita Parker inquired about the number of outreach testing sites in non-cluster COVID-19 area. In Community of Color are lacking and a concern that. HIV testing outreach in local community is limit in some areas.
- Ms. Gail McCallum-Perkins had a question/comment: Covid-19 does change the way we interpret government participation and behavior towards the vaccine. People are skeptical because of the constant in house fighting between government officials about what is to be done and the blame game that constantly get the population confused about what is the right thing to do.
- Ms. Tamara Wrenn had a question/comment: Research Alert: https://sacredbirth.ucsf.edu/ NY has about 6 surveys completed. The goal of the SACRED Birth study is to test a new survey tool called a Patient-Reported Experience Measure of Obstetrics racism, also known as the PREM-OB Scale, that was designed for, by, and with Black mothers and birthing people. The PREM-OB Scale allows for Black mothers and birthing people to share information a bout their unique patient experiences in hospital settings during labor, birth, and postpartum.
