New York State Golden Park Program

This is for New York State residents 62 or older. No application is needed. Simply show your New York State Driver License at the park entrance.* Or, show your New York State Non-Driver Identification Card. Either of these will serve as your pass.

This program gives you free vehicle access to most* state parks, boat launch sites, and arboretums. You can also access state historic sites and state-operated* golf courses for a discount. Offered Monday through Friday, except holidays.

New York State Access Pass Program

The Access Pass allows use not only of state parks, but also of boat launches, arboretums, state historic sites, and state-operated recreational facilities.** The Pass is not valid for amenities, such as some services or locations operated by an outside concessionaire.

To apply for an Access Pass, you must be a New York State resident and provide proof of disability. The application describes how to do this. You must also provide a recent photo of yourself. It will be attached to your Pass.
