Every day in the United States, 13 people go to work and never come home as a result of workplace-related incidents. These preventable tragedies devastate families and workplaces and damage the economy.

How many workers died from traumatic injuries at work in 2007 and 2008?

> 262 in New York State, excluding NYC

What were the leading causes or events that led to deaths at work?

- Transportation, including motor vehicle collisions, 88
- Contact with objects or equipment, 60
 - Struck by trees, 20
 - Caught in or compressed by equipment, 18
- Falls, 48
- Assaults and violent acts, 39

Who was at highest risk? (*Fatality rate per 100,000 workers.)

- Loggers, 267 deaths*
- Roofers, 77.5 deaths*
- Landscapers. 25.1 deaths*
- Hispanic/Latino foreign-born workers, 3.58 deaths*
- All New York State workers, 2.58 deaths*
