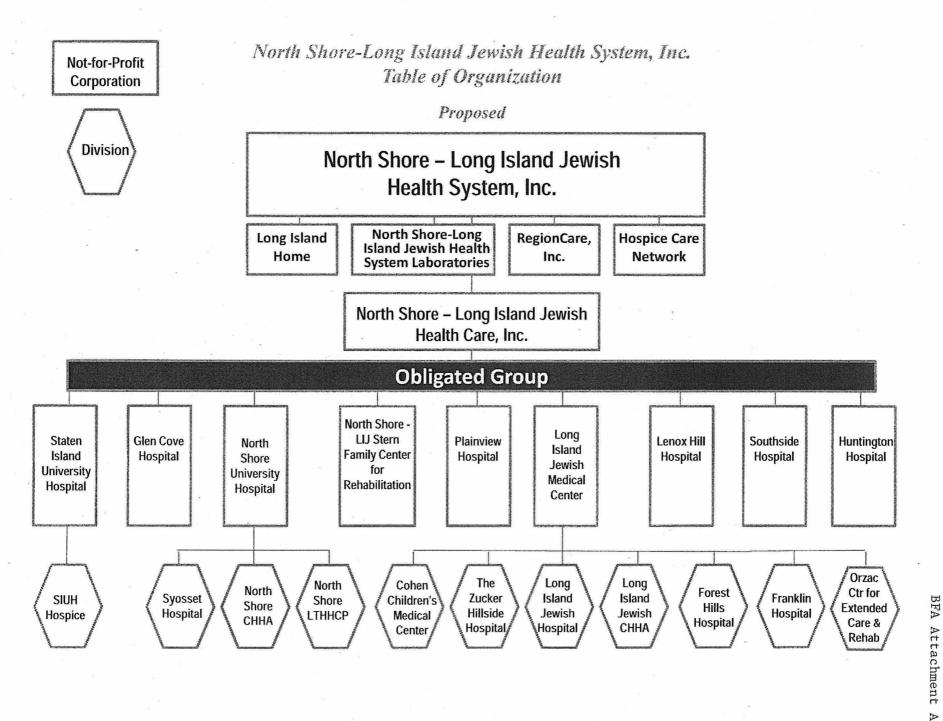

NOTES -- Explanation of Quality Indicators

- Note 1: Anemia is a common complication in people with kidney disease. Healthy kidneys produce a hormone called erythropoietin, or EPO, which stimulates the bone marrow to produce the proper number of red blood cells needed to carry oxygen to vital organs. Diseased kidneys, however, often don't make enough EPO. As a result, the bone marrow makes fewer red blood cells. - Note 5: Adults with kidney failure who get peritoneal dialysis need to be closely monitored to ensure that their blood is cleaned enough. This is measured by a blood test called Kt/V.

 Test results of 1.7 or higher show that the patient is getting the dialysis often enough and the right amount of dialysis solution. Peritoneal dialysis patients with Kt/V lower than 1.7 have a higher risk of health problems. [Data Period 10/1/12-9/30/13]
- Note 6: This shows the percentage of adult patients receiving regular hemodialysis at a certain facility who used an arteriovenous fistula for their treatment. The arteriovenous fistula is considered the best long-term vascular access for hemodialysis because it allows good blood flow, lasts a long time, and has a lower complication rate than other types of access. Although some patients may not be able to have an AV fistula or may not want one, facilities that have higher percentages may be doing a better job of helping patients understand why they are important.
