Required updated and completed phase 1 resubmission of non-quantitative treatment limitations workbooks to demonstrate compliance with the Mental Health Parity and Addiction Equity Act were not received by the State issued due date of October 30, 2019.

Plan of Correction with Timetable

The root cause for the failure to submit the workbooks timely was due to:

- A misunderstanding that CDPHP was to receive a written request from Milliman outlining the requested revisions; and
- A failure to follow-up with OMH while preparing the phase II response to inquire as to the status of the phase I revision request.

CDPHP will create a new method for timely submission of required responses that includes internal touch points and steps (prior to any due date) to determine if all information necessary to complete the request, including from New York State or its consultants, is received.

This will take effect immediately and Sheila Nelson, Senior Vice President, State Programs is responsible for this improvement.
