Native Americans and their families living on reservations in New When such a person is eligible (See OTHER **ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS** NATIVE AMERICANS), the cost of his/her care is shared by the State and federal government.

NYS will receive 100% Federal Financial Participation (FFP) when Medicaid services are provide through an Indian Health Services facility, whether operated by the Indian Health Service or by an Indian tribe or tribal organization, to Native Americans living on a

reservation.

Disposition: Local districts determine Medicaid eligibility for Native Americans

> and their families living on reservations using the appropriate category. The cost of care for such persons is fully reimbursed by
