TRANSFER OF ASSETS REGIONAL RATES

Regional rates are used to determine the period of restricted Medicaid coverage when a prohibited transfer is made. The rates listed below for each of the seven regions in the state are used for persons who apply for Medicaid as an institutionalized person on or after January 1, 2009.
