CATEGORICAL FACTORS

EMPLOYMENT SUBSIDIES

Description: An employer may subsidize the earnings of an individual with a

disability by paying more in wages than the reasonable value of

the actual services performed.

Policy: When determining whether or not subsidized employment

constitutes Substantial Gainful Activity (SGA), only the real value of the work is considered. When determining financial eligibility for Medicaid, the entire income from subsidized employment is

considered.

(a) When an apparently disabled individual is earning over the

Substantial Gainful Activity (SGA) figure (see page 33);

(b) When an individual's pay may not reflect the actual level of

productivity;

(c) When the A/R's employment is sheltered;

(d) When a childhood disability is involved; or

(e) When a mental impairment is involved.
